

Did you ever ask yourself:

 To what extent does Voluntourism perpetuate global inequalities rather than combating them?

OBJECTIVE

• The aim of this study is to characterise the connection between voluntourism practices and global inequalities.

METHODOLOGY

• The interdisciplinary research takes on a qualitative research design, informed by Post-Colonial Theory and an in-depth interview.



WHAT IS VOLUNTOURISM?

- · Voluntourism refers to a combination of volunteering and tourism
- Targets youth from the Global North to volunteer in the Global South



HOW DOES IT AFFECT GLOBAL INEQUALITIES?

- The motivations of participants raise doubts.
- Due to power asymmetries between Western organisations and local communities, voluntourism projects do not have to be helpful but can also have adverse effects
- Voluntourism can then lead to economic and social dependency.



Voluntourism has been recognised as fostering neo-colonial attitudes. Essentially, the depiction is created that communities in the Global South are 'waiting to be saved'. The industry then not only depoliticises global inequalities but also monetises them.



SO WHAT CAN BE DONE?

More needs to be done to ensure that voluntourism operates in a responsible manner. Changes in demands and expectations may facilitate this. For example, by:

- Implementing minimum ethical standards
- Adhering to legal guidelines and frameworks
- Acknowledging neo-colonial relationships
