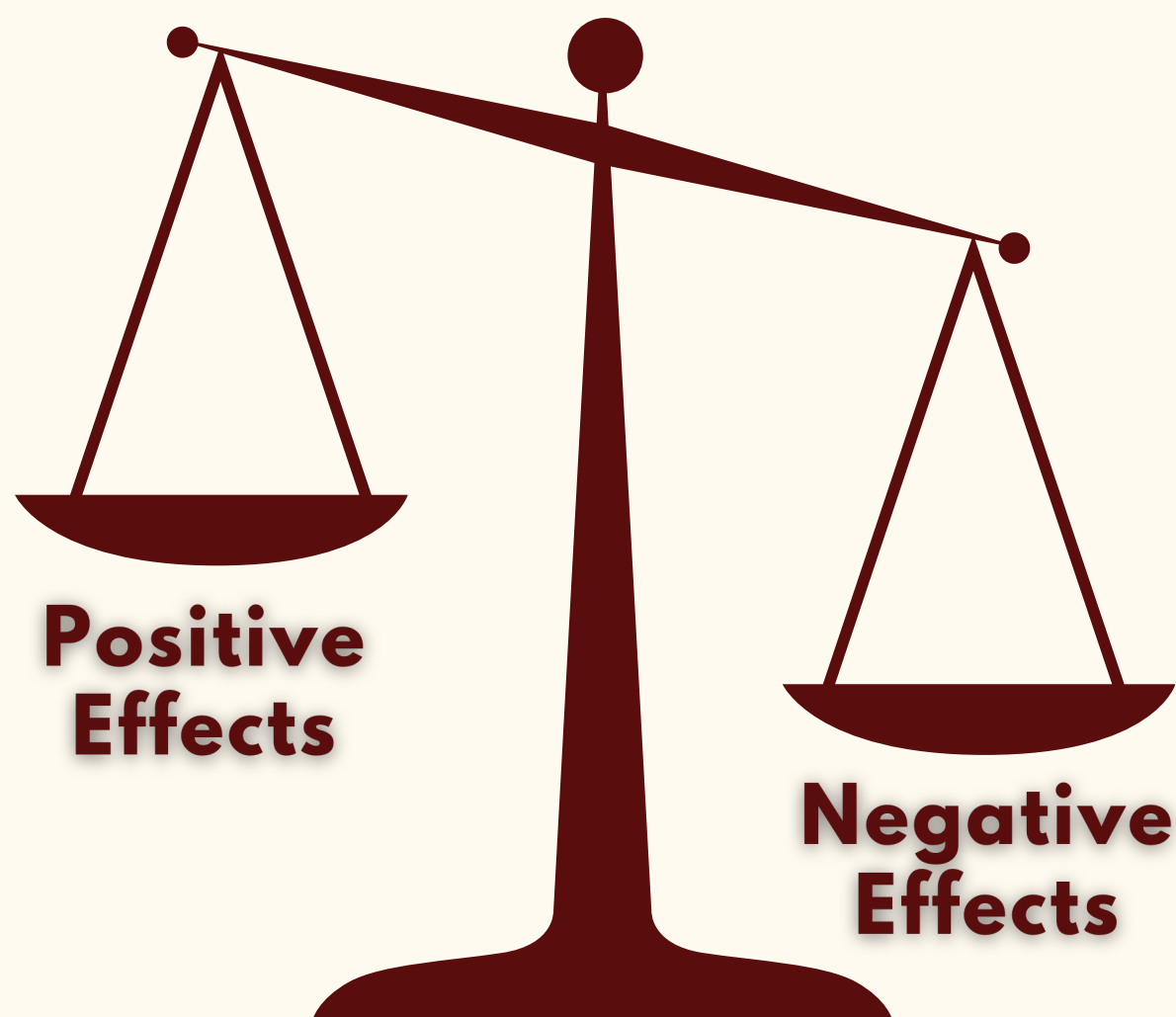

Integration Measures:

- some successful measures, such as increased funding, but effectiveness is undermined by stigmatization and negative associations with "non-Western" descent

Refugee Placement:

- Placement often results in isolation and compartmentalization overlooks individuals needs. People are just being moved around.
