#### INTRODUCTION

Socio-economic inequality remains a central issue in the European Union, affecting income, opportunities, and well-being (Eurofund, 2024).

Universal Basic Income (UBI) proposes a regular, unconditional cash payment to all individuals, regardless of employment or income status (Van Parijs & Vanderborght, 2017).

Through a mixed-methods approach, this study investigates: How can UBI be implemented as a solution to tackle socioeconomic inequality within the European Union?

#### **METHODOLOGY**

- Literature Review: Ideological, social, legal, and economic dimensions of UBI conceptually and at the EU level.
- Expert Interview: Insights from Mr. Antonios Triantafyllakis (Chair of UBI Europe).
- EU-wide survey: 134 valid EU resident responses via Qualtrics. Measure of public opinion and A/B design with different amounts (250€ or 1000€) tests implications on and usage by individuals.

#### LITERATURE REVIEW RESULTS

- UBI is widely **debated** as a tool to address systemic, intersectional inequalities.
- A gender-aware approach is essential to avoid reinforcing car and labour divisions.
- EU-wide implementation faces legal, financial, and ideological challenges.

#### CONCLUSION


- UBI can help address socioeconomic inequality in the EU and is feasible in principle, but not yet achievable due to public hesitation and political limitations.
- A gradual, bottom-up
  implementation—guided by
  strong design and supported
  through evidence-based pilots
  —is essential.
